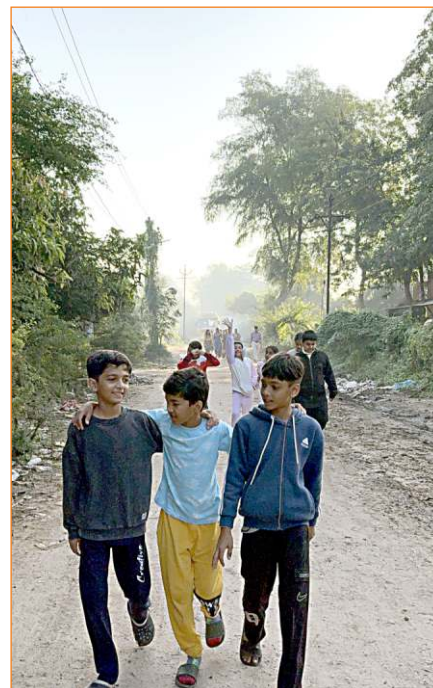
MIDDLE SCHOOL

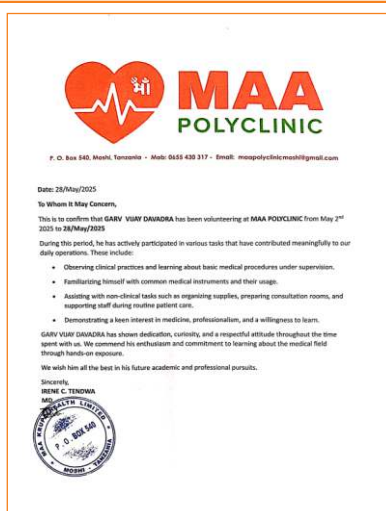
● Here's what our students had to say :

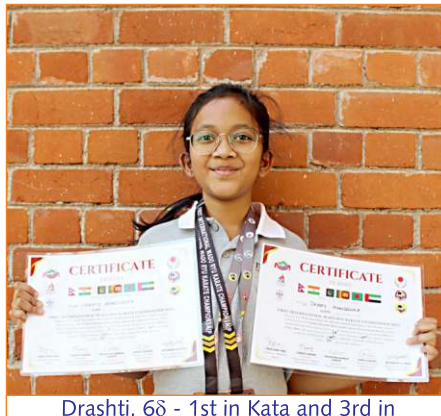
